Summary: Introductions were given. The August meeting summary was reviewed and accepted.

The Spark NH Policy Committee received the latest draft from Peggy Kieschnick of the white paper to accompany the "Framework for Action for New Hampshire's Young Children." The committee reviewed the draft recommendations for each of the 10 policies outlined in the Framework. The committee then came to consensus and approved the white paper. The final draft will be submitted to the Office of the Governor.

The committee discussed the roll out of the white paper once the review and the comments from the Office of the Governor are complete. It was decided to not have an October Policy Committee meeting as the members were

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urged to attend the Oct 5 event, "Transforming Tomorrow's Workforce Today." The committee will be notified when word has been received from the Office of the Governor. The November meeting will be held as scheduled.

Claudette Mallory gave the update on the work of the taskforce on the Child Care and Development Fund (CCDF) State Plan. Other committee members present who serve on the CCDF taskforce also reported out. The taskforce is currently deliberating over changing the system to include more approved, paid absences.

Updates were given on Spark NH's regional partnerships with the Coös Coalition for Young Children and Families, Project Launch in Manchester, the Lakes Region Financial Stability Partnership, the Safe Schools/Healthy Students Program, and Impact Monadnock.

The meeting evaluations were positive.
